Complimentary Etiquette

Lil Range

We all already know that bridge has a ZERO TOLERANCE policy, which means that you cannot say unkind things to your partner or opponents. At least, you cannot say unkind things at the bridge club. (The bridge club has nothing to say about what you do away from the bridge club.) For example, you cannot say "bad play" to anyone at the face-to-face club, or at the online table.

Now look at the opposite situation. Let's say your partner makes a brilliant play. It seems natural to compliment your partner in this situation. For example, at the online club we often see phrases such as WDP (Well Done, Partner) or WPP (Well Played, Partner). However, opponents can hear or see these comments. They may already feel badly about the way they bid or played the hand, and the compliment may make them feel even worse.

What do to, then? The best strategy when your partner makes a brilliant play is to SAY NOTHING AT THE TABLE. Instead, wait until later to give that compliment. Wait until you are out of earshot if you are at the face-to-face club, or at the next table if you are online.

Note, at the online Swiss game or any online game, you cannot speak to your partner privately when there are cards to be played. However, when the playing is completed for the round, you can chat to the whole table, or to partner privately. Chat the compliment to your partner privately.

An implication of this guideline is that silence from partner means WELL DONE, PARTNER. Come out and try Swiss. The online Swiss is at 2:00 Sunday and 6:50 Thursday (Central time). It lasts just over two hours, 20 boards, stratified. If you want to play or have questions, text, or call Lil, 504 330 1158.

Parking:

For the Nationals, you will receive a 30% discount on parking at the Marriott by saying you were at the bridge tournament when you check out. The discount price will be \$12 for 5 hours, \$17 for 10 hours and \$35 for overnight excluding tips for the valet. Carry your convention card just in case there is an issue.

LBA will further subsidize parking by \$10 per day. The **\$10 discount coupons** will be available in late **February at the club**. You are entitled to one coupon for each day you drive and park at the Marriott. You will receive an email notice when you can pick up the coupons.

2023 NABC INTERMEDIATE/NOVICE PLAYERS (0-299)

Preparation

Line up partners.

Know how many masterpoints you have.

Create a convention card for each partner. (Bring blank cards if you are playing with someone new.)

If you would like help filling out a convention card, attend the **seminar** at the club on **Feb. 25**.

Games

Each game stands alone; you do not need to play in both the 10 am game and 3pm game. You can earn red points (not gold).

Location

3rd floor -Salon D (Gold Rush games are held in the same room, but they are separate.) **On the first day, March 9, the games will be in a different location.** Stay tuned.

Reception

There will be a reception for you in the game room - date & time to be announced

The Gold Rush Games (0-750)- Games Thursday 3/9 thru Friday 3/17

They are held in the same room as the 0-299 games.

They are stratified. You are compared to those with your same master point level. By playing twice in one day (10 and 3), you can earn the treasured gold points.

The intermediate/Novice Desk

It is located outside the playing area (open before the games.) Kathy Plauche, Wayne Weisler, and volunteers will man the desk. They will answer questions and help those who need partners. The ACBL has an extra gift for you at the desk.
