Playing Online?

If you are an online player through Bridgebase.com (BBO), we encourage you to play in games run by our virtual club (vacb221739 LBA/LBC/ET AL) rather than in an ACBL game. Why? Our virtual club includes many District 10 clubs. Most important, we net nearly half of the \$5 entry fee as profit for our club. In addition, the masterpoints earned are **Black** points unless it is a special game which awards **red, silver or gold** master points.

Although the ACBL games are slightly cheaper, LBA does not get a single penny of that entry fee. Also, only **colorless** masterpoints are awarded which do not fulfill any required color points for Life Master levels.

So, if you would like to see LBA keep their doors open, please play either face to face at the club, in our virtual club games on BBO, or both. Bookmark this link for online games which appear 2 hours prior to the games:
