OBSERVATIONS OF A BEGINNER

In my first article I wrote about my reluctance to get trumps out. In the second article, I wrote about my three major mistakes and my attempts to improve my game.

My bridge partners are threatening to write a separate article called "Richard does not practice what he preaches."

In the beginning of my playing bridge, a more experienced player introduced me to Bridge Base Online (BBO)

Playing BBO on my phone has made me a more patient fellow. I am more patient in a doctor's office, its big waiting room, and its small waiting room. I am more patient waiting for my wife to come out of Perlis or Langensteins, Costco or Walmart. (Uptown ladies only go to a Walmart when it is near their second home.)

Now, I prefer playing online with Bridge Mentor. It allows you to touch the bids and conventions with your cursor, giving you an explanation of their meaning. It has an *undo* button that allows you to back up the cards and the bids. The idea is to back up a card played, or a bid made and to experiment with different choices.

Bridge Mentor also has a *replay* button. I realized that after I play a hand and go down by one or two tricks, I can replay it, focusing on where I made mistakes and now make additional tricks. It works well for me. In the last two months, my focus has been on counting winners and losers. I can now count winners and losers on Bridge Mentor without the pressure of three other people waiting for me to play.


