### Help Wanted

If you have an interesting hand, story or tip for the Kibitzer, please let the editor know. It need not be expert bridge material. We are looking for articles on all levels, and entertaining stuff too.

**PAUL'S DEAL OF THE MONTH.** Have you ever had the opportunity to defeat four multiple world champions playing together in a Regional Swiss Team Sunday event? My regular "Mixed Team," consisting of Craig and Carole Cordes, Jan Galey and me, had that very slim chance some ten years ago in the Biloxi Regional and succeeded. We were leading the field going into the final match. And wouldn't you know it just had to be. The opponents for the final match at our table were Meckstroth and Soloway. At the other table they were Rodwell and Cohen. Here's the hand that did the damage. (below left)

North	My partner, Jan, sitting North, opened the bidding with 1D. The opponents were silent throughout the auction (but complained bitterly of "bad luck" when the session was over). Key Card Blackwood was still in its infancy at the time but fortunately we had recently discussed whether Blackwood bid immediately over an opening bid of one of a suit was "Key Card" for opener's suit or not and had decided that "NOT" was the word of the day. So I immediately blasted into good, old fashioned Blackwood for Aces and learned that partner had two when she replied 5H. I raised to 6H, creating the novelty that the opening bidder, with a void in hearts, was the declarer in a slam in her void suit!
♠Axxx	East was on lead and held the ♠QJ109, so the ♠Q hit the table. Winning the trick with dummy's singleton ♠K, trumps were quickly drawn, following which declarer crossed to her hand to the ♦A, discarded dummy's losing diamond on the ♠A and conceded a trick to the ♣A—making six hearts.

When we compared scores after the last match we learned with amazement that 6H had been reached but had gone down at the other table! How could that be? The mystery was solved when our partners told us that their opponents' auction had gone 1D-P-2H-P-2S-P-4NT-P-5H-P-6H, placing West on lead. The opening lead was the ♦K, from a holding of ♦KQJ. The bizarre result of that lead was that declarer still had the same twelve tricks which had been cashed at our table but they could not be reached and cashed because dummy's ♦A, the only quick entry allowing the ♠A and ♠K to be cashed separately, had been removed. Declarer had to lose a diamond and a club in the end game, down one. So I ask you, was it by luck or by skill that we won that event? I don't really know but I'll tell you this much. It's now over ten years later, I still play frequently on that same mixed team and I still use ordinary good, old fashioned Blackwood for Aces directly over an opening bid of one of a suit. Bridge--what a great game!
